
Mexico-Completely digitized its curriculum in 2009

Virtual Education in The United States

- Clayton Christensen-In <u>Disrupting Class</u>, by 2019 50% of all classes will be online.
- Increased Exponential growth-1.5 million (2009 est.) up from 500,000+ in 2006
- Current attitudes- 39 statewide programs, the others through districts.

Issues Confronting Virtual Education In the U.S.

- Low cost perception
- Cultural discomfort with the model
- Job protection Class ratios Less capable veteran staff
- Private corporation/public funding dilemma
- State provider/Parent choice conflict
